Potato control on a practicabl basic is proposed to farmers by the Agricultural Adjustment ad-ministration.

The first is the payment of 25 The first is the payment of 25 cents to farmers for each hundred pounds of potatoes which they withdraw from regular market channels and dispute of for feed and industrial purposes, such as manufacture of alcohol and starch. This applies to only 10 per cent of each farmer's production.
