Suit to Vacate Mandamus Writ Favoring Russ Alford Denied

The Illinois supreme court Wed-needay desired the petition of Lew A. Hendee, Lake county clerk, for an appeal from the circuit court ruling that dismissed his election contest against Russ Alford.
