CLASS LEGISLATION

While unemployment and old age insurance legislation is popular with the majority of the citizens, the fact that the unemployment plan passed by the Illinois house is decidedly class and discriminatory legislation, and as such is very unwill eventually be realized by many socially magnant souls who now approve it.

Under this plan doctors, lawyers, farmers, employers and all employes pay for unemployment insurance and only em-ployes of large industries can be benefitted by it. The follow-ing brief explanation of the cost of the plan is taken from a ive review distributed by the Illinois Manufac-

"While the taxes which are contemplated by this legislation are levied upon payrolls of employers and workers and collected from employers, employers of Illinois will not be able to assume the responsibility of the huge burden of these taxes. This tax burden will accordingly be shifted to the consumer of goods just as the Illinois sales tax burden is shifted to the consumer. The tax will be found in the price the consumer pays for what he uses—in effect another
