Marine Corps Supported
By Every Navy of World
The famous Marine Corps, best known for service to France and later the occupation of Haiti and Nicaragua, was founded as the result of an act of the Continental Congress, passed November 10, 1775. Two battalions of marines were authorized by these early legislators who met in Philadelphia.

In the Spanish-American war in 1898 the marine corps consisted of 2,000 enlisted men. It was steadily increased until 1917, when 13,124 men were ready to fight for Uncle Sam when this country entered the World War. But when the battles of Belleau Wood, Soissons, Champagne, Mont Hain, Meuse Argonne and the Rhine were brought to an end there were 51,824 marines serving with the A. E. F.
