Treatment Plant and Sewers to Be Constructed by Two Firms

Village trustees at an advisory meeting Wednesday night passed a resolution approving the awarding of contracts on the conditions set out below and subject to the approval of the state sanitary water board.

Approval has been given award of contracts for the treatment plant and sewers on the Barrington project, which the PWA announced Tuesday. The contract for the treatment plant was awarded A. L. Jackson and company, 121 E. Erie street, Chicago, on a base bid of \$324,214 with items 71, 73, 74, 75, 76, 79 and 82 deducted. The Alford Bridge and construction company, 290 N. Wells street, Chicago, was awarded the contract for sewers on a base bid of \$1,037,275 with items 8, 23, 31, 34, 35, 36, 37, 48 and 49 deducted.
