Several Changes Are Made in High School Grid Rules

Ten changes in the interscholastic high school football rules were adopted by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations rules committee at the conclusion of its two-day meeting in Chicago, Saturday.

- 1. The major changes were as follows:
2. Jumping with both feet or knees foremost was ruled unnecessary roughness. This eliminated the section on burbling.
3. Tackling a runner out of bounds will be considered unnecessary roughness with such ruling made mandatory upon the referee. Responsibility for knowing that the runner is out of bounds is placed upon the tackler.
4. The rule relative to unnecessary roughness in connection with neck and head tackle will be strengthened. The new wording of this rule will specifically prohibit twisting.
5. The intermission between quarters were lengthened to two minutes, and between halves to fifteen minutes.
6. A subcommittee was named to write in greater detail a tentative draft on what constitutes interference in a forward pass.

Other games Friday are Antioch at Barrington, Wauconda at Grant, and Ela at Warren.

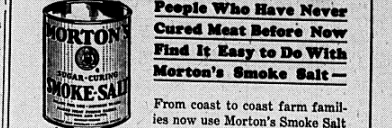
Jewel Tea Drops Game to Haeger Potteries

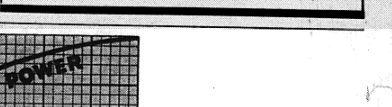

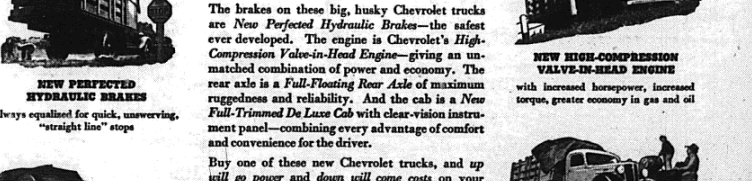
