much better and more modern plan was designed than originally planned. The village board of trustees through the engineers and others recognized the fact that owing to conditions in the territory lying between the village and Fox River it was necessary to provide a sewage treatment plant that would make the best quality of effluent possible. Therefore it was decided to build an activated sludge type of plant larger than ordinarily planned, for a population of about 7000 and to provide several pumps so the operation of the plant could be adjusted to different rates of sewage flow, insuring more efficient operation. Having regarded the various phases of the Barrington sewer case from every angle, it seems that the village board of trustees took the proper step in providing the sewage treatment plant now set up in the project.

Mr. Blanks explained and cited figures to show that any increased cost of labor and materials purchased was so slight as not to be important factors in the increased cost of the entire system.
