

Organize Program for Extension of Farm-Home Life

E. Harris of Grayslake Made Chairman at Meeting at Farmers' Hall

The committee appointed to set up a coordinated extension program in agriculture and home-making in Lake county met to select officers and officially start work at the Farmers' hall at Grayslake, March 29. This committee was appointed under the direction of Dean H. W. Mumford, College of Agriculture, University of Illinois.

E. Harris of Grayslake was elected chairman and Mrs. L. A. Mills, vice chairman. Farm Advisor H. C. Gilkerson will serve as secretary and Home Advisor Florence Kimmelschick will act as assistant secretary to the committee.

Present at the launching of the committee's work were C. S. Rhoads and Martha Hendry, representing the extension service in agriculture and home economics of the College of Agriculture, University of Illinois. They outlined the scope and work of the committee and the need for a coordinated extension program in this county and the committee decided, after two afternoons of study and discussion, that the subject matter most study were: rural youth education, the dairy problem, poultry production, soil conservation, family food supply, and improving and beautifying the farm home.

'Save Human Lives' Is Pledge of H. D. Kelsey in Campaign

Harold D. Kelsey, republican candidate for nomination as Lake county coroner and supervisor of Cuba township, has adopted a safety program for automobile traffic as his campaign platform. He proposed to use the safety records compiled by the city of Evanston in maintaining its safety record.

"By studying the cause of accidents, the corrective measures needed, and future protective measures," Mr. Kelsey states, "the coroner in his position as caring for the welfare of human life can do a great deal to prevent the mishaps occurring every year."

"The loss of human lives in 1935 in this country was 30,000, he further states, "and the amount is equal to the population of Waukegan and part of North Chicago. My proposal to eliminate road traffic accidents, to protect them with adequate lighting, to also, the careful posting of a dangerous curve and intersections in the country would not be an expensive undertaking to the taxpayer, but the fruits of careful study would return a wealth not calculable in human lives saved."

Mr. Kelsey is 38 years old, the fifth generation of his family in this state, and was born and educated in the community. He has been in farm work all his life and has devoted a great deal of time to the political welfare of Cuba township.
