Preparations Made for Building of Homestead Project at Libertyville

Construction of 50 new houses and barns planned for Lake county homesteads, near Libertyville, will begin as soon as weather conditions permit, the Resettlement

administration announced this week. It is hoped that 100 men will be employed on construction work within the next two or three weeks, and that the homes will be suitably ready for occupancy by July 1.

The addition of three remodeled homes to these being newly built in this area will mean a total of 53 houses with electricity and

running water, and combination barns and poultry houses. These three remodeled houses are now completed. The project manager at Libertyville is George P. Gonzalez; the resident engineer, Leslie W. Lapp.

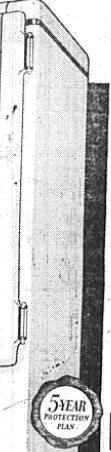
