### Dundee Patrolman Jailed in Surprise Attack by Three Burglars Tuesday

Louis Lange, night policeman at West Dundee, was locked in jail following a surprise attack made by three burglars whom he had apprehended while they were attempting to enter Riverdale garden tavern Tuesday morning.

Patrolman Lange was making an inspection round when he came upon the youth. Drawing his gun, he covered them, and took a small jimmy bar away from them. He then made a hasty search for weapons and failing to find any, ordered the youth to the jail.

When they reached the cell-room, Lange dropped his guard for a moment while he made arrangements to place the trio behind the bars. One of the gang pulled an automatic pistol from his clothing and ordered Lange to drop his weapon. He threw his gun upon a table but refused to relinquish his keys.

The trio found they could lock him in without keys and did so, immediately making a break for liberty. Lange released himself quickly but the gang had disappeared without a trace. They have not been apprehended as yet and no definite description of them could be obtained.

**Village Settles Creek Suit With Property Owners**

To Pay \$5500 Condemnation Expenses; Special Meeting Held Thursday

Settlement of Flint creek flowage rights cases between the village of Barrington and owners of property along the creek north of Northwest highway was made at a special meeting held in the council chambers Thursday night. The flowage rights needed to legalize use of the creek as sewer system outlet were obtained with 40-year leases at an approximate sum of \$3000 plus legal expense which amounted to \$2500.

The condemnation proceedings were being heard in the circuit court of Lake county and had been in progress since a week ago Monday. After the case with 40-year leases which ended in the compromise settlement was held. The property owners had sought a total of \$120,000.

The village originally offered \$1700. It was expected that a settlement could be reached without recourse to law.

The settlement was entered in court Friday by mutual agreement of both parties. The village assumed the legal expense of lawyers and witnesses in the case for both sides.

By virtue of the agreement the village will have the right to empty properly treated effluent into Flint creek at the intersection of the creek and Northwest highway for the next 40 years.

The settlement was completed through the cooperation of the entire village board and its president Earl Hatz, as well as D. B. Maloney, village attorney, and A. Consoer, village engineer.
