R. Lyons Endorsed by Two Groups in Coming Primaries

Rep. Richard J. Lyons of Libertyville has received endorsement of the Illinois Agricultural Association for his staunch support of the farm program in Illinois. This means that his record in voting for farm bills is 100 per cent and that he has voted for every bill that would benefit agriculture. The farm association in its endorsement indicates it wants him back in legislation to continue his support for rural groups.

Rep. Lyons also received support and endorsement of the Legislative Voters League of Illinois. In its report they state, "He showed unusual courage and effectiveness in fighting for good measures and in opposition to bad measures" during various sessions of legislature.

The tenacity that Rep. Lyons displayed in pushing measures that would benefit the general public and taxpayers is lauded in a summary of work of the last session of legislature.

Opponents killed Lyons' fight to limit auto license fees to a flat \$1 but he states that he will again introduce it at the next session and give the motorists a real reduction instead of the reduction that the administration was forced to give.

"Lyons will no doubt be re-elected by a large majority," is the opinion of political forecasters.
