Harold D. Kelsey Stresses Campaign on Safety Program

Stating that he faithfully had tried to explain his platform as a republican candidate for county coroner, Harold D. Kelsey, of Barrington, in giving his campaign and planned to give the two remaining days to the routine business of getting the voters to the polls.

"My belief is that a coroner can save lives as well as preside over inquests to determine the cause of death. I am certain that the auto death rate in the county can be cut by making this a full time office so that traffic accidents at railway crossings, bad highway curves and intersections can be studied and eliminated by the offering of plans for changing the proper authorities," Mr. Kelsey said.

"The present coroner's law dates back to 1879. It should be brought up to 1936 and I believe I can do this. I will give full time to the office with this aim in mind so that Lake county can be pointed out as pioneering in modernizing government to meet present day needs. Recommendations to legislators on amendments to the law would bring it up from 1879 to 1936. If it can't be done then scrap the office and let the sheriff handle the work of coroner as the antiquated act of 1879 has value to this extent and better than any additional tax burden. But, it can be an important and vital office if modernized," Mr. Kelsey declared.

He has pledged economy and his record shows that when he was chairman of the county board of supervisors in 1934 the Lake county debt was reduced slightly more than \$390,000 in one alone.
