

Baseball Draws Seven Conference Schools for Title

Season Starts April 17 With Warren Favored to Win Championship

Baseball in the Northwest conference schools is gaining in popularity if the number of institutions adopting the sport is any criterion. Seven schools have since put practicing for the opening on Friday, April 17.
