

# Deerfield Shields School Wins Lake County Track Championship

## Takes Trophy for Third Consecutive Year at Waukegan

### Barrington Ties Grant High School for Fourth With 15 Points

Deerfield-Shields high school again proved its superiority over schools in Lake county by taking the Lake county track championship for the third consecutive year at the meet run off at Waukegan high school Tuesday afternoon. The Deerfield outfit scored 57 1/2 points to win. Libertyville ran a close second in scoring 46 1/2 points. Waukegan finished third with 20 points while Barrington and Grant tied for fourth with 15 points.
