Second May Clinic of Tuberculosis Association Will Be Held Wednesday

The second of the May chest clinics will be held at the St. Therese hospital in Waukegan Wednesday, May 20, the local Tuberculosis association announced this week.

At the first clinic in May, 33 patients were examined. Of the four new cases making their first visit to the clinic, one adult was found to have an active case of pulmonary tuberculosis, two others were considered suspects although a positive diagnosis could not be made from that examination.

At the five clinics held since January 1936, 246 patients have received examinations, 46 of these being new cases. Ten cases of active tuberculosis were diagnosed, 29 were considered suspects and 16 were examined because of contact with a case of tuberculosis. Thirty-eight of the new cases were children.

This free clinic service for Lake County people is made possible by the annual sale of Christmas seals.
