Ela travels to Lake Forest Friday, May 15, to play the Gold Coasters in what may be the deciding game of the conference championship. A comparison of the two teams shows Ela has a stronger hitting outfit but Lake Forest is better in fielding. The pitching by both teams has been good and the victory will probably go to the team producing the best pitching.
