### Pure Milk Association Sponsors Neatest Farm Contest for Members

Pure Milk association again renewed its recognition of the neatest dairy farms in the Chicago milk shed, with the announcement this week that entries in its third annual Chicagoand Neatest Farms Contest will be accepted up to midnight, June 30.

Each year the association rewards those of its 14,500 members who have the neatest dairy farms. To each farm that receives a rating of 90 per cent or better is given an "Award of Merit" plaque. A winner is chosen in each of the 15 districts of the association, which covers 33 counties in northern Illinois, southern Wisconsin, and northern Indiana. A grand champion is selected from the 15 district winners.

The farms that receive the appellation, "Pure Milk association Neatest Dairy Farm," are selected on the following basis:

1. General appearance of the dairy farm, 50 per cent;
2. condition of the dairy barn and herd, 20 per cent;
3. condition of the milk house, milk utensils, and

other equipment, 20 per cent; 4. condition of all other buildings on the farm, 10 per cent.

Last year 84 dairy farms received the "Award of Merit" over a field of approximately 200 neat dairy farms that were entered in the contest. Last year's Grand Champion Farm belonged to George Ohlendorf of Crete, Ill.

### August Reuter Explains Best Method of Oiling Roads to Avoid Waste

Residents of Barrington township petition to oil the roads near

their properties have been advised by August Reuter, Barrington town highway commissioner, to see that surfaces have been conditioned and sand applied immediately after oiling to prevent loss of the oil when the roads are scraped.

To insure a lasting job, he reported, it is necessary to have the road in good condition and also to apply a binder by sanding. Highway scrapers, working on the roads later, remove the oil surface unless this binder has been applied.
