"Awake and Sing" Now in Chicago at Selwyn Theatre

Funeral services for Mrs. Amelia Walschlager, former resident of Barrington township, were held the 26th funeral home in Dundee Friday afternoon and burial took place at Barrington Center cemetery. Rev. Charles R. Drussel, the Baptist church officiated.

Mrs. Walschlager was born in Grout, Iowa, on May 1, 1864.
