Close Schools to Prevent Spread of Scarlet Fever

28 Cases, All Reported Light; Act to Halt Further Increase

An increase in the number of scarlet fever cases during the past week prompted the school board to close the public grade school Tuesday morning. St. Anne's parochial school also closed Tuesday morning. The village board with the school board before the action was taken Monday night.

Wednesday night the school board met and ordered the high school closed for the duration of the week.

The action was really precautionary measures taken to stop further spread. Most or all cases reported are light, and the number is still far below the totals in epidemics of recent years.

If no more cases develop by Saturday, classes in high school will be resumed Monday morning. Should there be no more cases the Baccalaureate services, class night program and commencement exercises will be held. The senior class play and class parties have been called off.

The public library has been closed until further notice and no scout meetings are being held.

The total number of cases reported to E. W. Baude, health officer, and at present in quarantine is 23. Nine cases were from last week. Only 12 homes were affected this week, several families having more than one case. Nineteen cases were reported since last Thursday.

Miss Ida Schuder, registered nurse from the Chicago Tuberculosis Institute who has been in Barrington for the past week, following the following statement Wednesday: "The scarlet fever situation in Barrington is well in hand and by care and cooperation, we can prevent the spread of this disease and a serious epidemic."
