

Restrictions Are Lifted After Drop in Scarlet Fever

24 Persons in Quarantine at Present; Six Cases This Week

Six cases of scarlet fever were reported to E. W. Baade, health officer, since last Wednesday, making a total of 34 in the recent wave of cases.

Those reported in quarantine this week were Beverly Bolin, Marion Hubbes, Wayne Rike, Alfred Pakke, Ellen Kleinsmith and Mary Jane Shepard.

The restrictions placed on public gatherings has been temporarily eased upon the recommendation of health authorities.

If no great increase is noted before Sunday, activities such as Sunday school, movies and other public gatherings where children are a part will be resumed.

In an interview given to the Barrington Review Wednesday, W. C. VanWormer, state health officer for this district, stated, "The situation is well in hand in Barrington with everything possible being done. There is little cause for alarm."

Ministers of the local churches were instructed to prepare for resumption of Sunday school classes and the restriction made by W. R. Catlow, manager of the local theatre, against children at the movies has been removed upon advice of the health board.

Russell LaPointe Writes From Panama on World Cruise

Russell LaPointe, Barrington boy who joins the marine corps early this year, is enjoying the thrill of world travel on the U.S.S. Henderson which is at this time enroute from the Panama Canal Zone to San Diego.

Russell went through training at Norfolk, Virginia, where his platoon earned the world tour on the U.S.S. Henderson by winning recognition as the best drilled unit at the station.

T. B. Infection Reported Small in Lake County Herds

Lake County dairy farmers and T. P. Gallahue, county veterinarian, received praise from the state department of agriculture in a letter presented to the board of supervisors of Lake county Tuesday.

The letter commended the keeping of reactors to less than one-half of one per cent in the tuberculosis eradication program.

The letter from the agricultural department was read following a report made by Veterinarian Gallahue of the progress of bovine tuberculosis eradication from January 1 to June 8 in Lake county.

His review showed that 763 herds for a total of 15,127 cattle were examined during the period and 63 cattle, or 41 per cent, were reactors. The 63 reactors were from 26 different herds.

The total salvage received from the reactors was \$2536 and the indemnity was \$1878.13 for a total of \$4414.13.
