

13 Lake Zurich Boys Represent School at Meet

F. F. A. Chapter Members of Ela High School Visit Champaign

Thirteen members of the Future Farmers of America of Ela Township high school, Lake Zurich, competed in a state judging contest at the state convention of the F.F.A. at Urbana from Thursday to Saturday inclusive. The group from Lake Zurich placed 11th in competition with 287 schools in the state. More than 2000 boys participated.

Awards were given to the first five places. The Ela group was first in points behind the tenth place winners, having 28.5 points. Judging was done in rings of material made up of livestock and grain belonging to the University of Illinois.

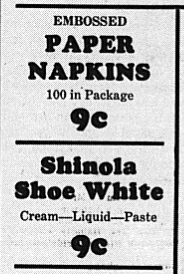
