William Thorpe, 517 Grove avenue, returned from the Sherman hospital Sunday where he had been an inpatient for several weeks.

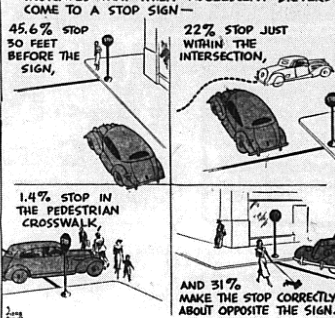
