

How Indians Tanned Hides

The process used by the Indians in tanning deer hides was first seen at all fat and flesh adhering to the skin. Then the fat and brains of the deer would be rubbed into the flesh side and the skin rinsed in water repeatedly. It was a long and tedious process to create a really fine piece of buckskin, states a writer in the Detroit News, but the Indians did not mind for they had plenty of time on their hands and, anyway, the squaws did most of the work. Two kinds of buckskins were created; one was white and the other smoke-tanned. The white was reportedly smoked during the tanning process over a small fire with plenty of smoke. After many weeks of labor the hide would be ready for fashioning in garments.

Base Price Raised By Pure Milk Group

Pure Milk association members will receive a gross price of 50 cents per hundred pounds of the ordinary price for 3.5 grade A milk. This price applies to 100 per cent of base and is effective beginning July 16. All milk delivered in excess of 100 per cent of base will be paid for at ten cents per hundred pounds over ordinary price. Cans indicated that this agreement will be in effect until further notice. All farmers will be paid on the basis of 1.6. Chicago reported Wednesday that they had taken no action to set on price increase to consumers as have dairies in other communities. Lakes Claim Lives of Two Swimmers at Nearby Towns

First Fatality in Six Years Occurs at Lake Zurich Sunday

One man was drowned in Bang Lake at Wauconda and one died of a broken neck while diving at Lake Zurich over the weekend. To make the first swimming fatalities of the year in this community and the first death in Lake Zurich in six years occurred Sunday.

Walter Alchewicz, 2515 W. Forty-third street, Chicago, was drowned Sunday while swimming in Bang Lake at Wauconda. He was accompanied by a couple had come from Chicago to escape the heat. He had gone out a distance while swimming and disappeared. The fathers at the lake formed a long line across the lake about 200 feet from shore and started searching for his body. They soon recovered Alchewicz, but efforts to revive him failed.

Mooney's head struck the bottom of the lake which is shallow at the point near the platform. He died shortly after the accident. A third victim, Fred Nelson, 1815 S. 12th street, Chicago, was drowned in a Pirates lake when he fell from a rowboat as he was stepping to the pier, Sunday.
