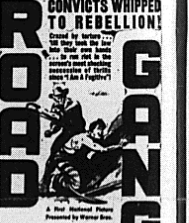
Chicago Youth Is Drowned at Shady Hill Beach Sunday
William Benson, 9, Victim of Fatally While Outing With Family
William Benson, nine-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Hilton Benson, 7647 Throop street, Chicago, was drowned while swimming in the Fox River at the Shady Hill subdivision beach in Cuba township Sunday afternoon. The time of the fatality was 4 o'clock.
According to testimony given by the boy's father at an inquest conducted by Dr. John Taylor, Lake county coroner, the child, a son of Oliver Pitts, the boy had gone swimming and was not missed for some time. When the body was recovered from the river, resuscitation methods were applied but the youth failed to respond.
A doctor from Gary was called at the scene and the inhalator equipment brought out from the Danielson and Wilmering funeral parlors, but they were unable. Testimony also revealed that a heart condition might have been partly responsible for the death.
The Benson family had gone to Shady Hill subdivision for a picnic with friends and relatives. The body was removed to Chicago Sunday for burial.

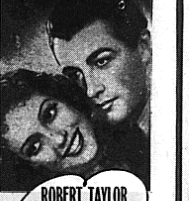

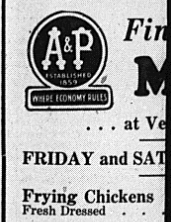
