**Driver Unhurt as Truck Burns Friday**  
Walter Adams, truck driver for Algonquin Bakery company, narrowly escaped serious injuries and possible death when a leaky gasoline tank on the machine burst into flames on route 25 about three miles southeast of Algonquin Friday evening.  
The truck and its contents were burned. A money bag, containing an unknown amount of currency and silver, was destroyed, the coin money being the only salvageable item from the burning.

Adams told officials of the Algonquin fire department that he was driving along the highway when a sheet of flames suddenly shot from the rear of the truck. He pulled the vehicle to the edge of the road and leaped to safety.

The entire cab of the truck was a mass of flames in a few minutes and spread so rapidly that when the Algonquin firemen arrived, there was little to save.

**Bowler Hats**  
The Bowler hat is about a hundred years old, and its origin is an interesting one. It was first called a "coker" and was designed by William Coke, Esq., who went very early to London in Leicester in the middle of the last century. Coke designed the hat for riding, especially for hunting on the formal occasions when the tophat was (and is) out of place. The hunting bowler is very much worn. Later the Earl of Derby started wearing the bowler in town and as it had general acceptance in London it became known as the "derby" by which name it is generally referred to in this country.

**Measles Freezing Point**  
Water will freeze when heated in a vacuum; it will freeze at a point 1.3-100 of a degree higher than the ordinary freezing point. To freeze, water must expand. By placing a great pressure upon it, it is possible to reduce the freezing point. Experiments have kept it from freezing. By this method, water is several degrees below the zero of the Fahrenheit scale. Correspondingly, by reducing the normal pressure on the water expansion is free and the freezing point is raised. The atmosphere pressure being comparatively slight, the reduction of a vacuum serves to raise the freezing point only a small fraction of a degree.

**Federal Ransom**  
The United States has paid a total of about \$55,000,000 in ransom for American captives. This ransom or tribute money was paid to Algeria, pirates of the Barbary States on the north coast of Africa in the first decade of the American republic's existence. Annual payments ceased only after the United States fought and won the Barbary States war, in which such famous commanders as Commodore Decatur, Rodgers and Barrow took part.

**William Overheu Sr. Elected to Vacancy Created by Action Monday**  
Fred Otto, road commissioner of Cook, surprised voters of that town, who had gathered at an adjourned meeting, with an unexpected measure at Schauble Bros. an Collins garage, Monday morning, with his resignation from the office of road commissioner which was read by Supervisor H. D. Kealey.

The resignation was effective Monday morning.

The reasons for the move, as stated by Mr. Kealey, revealed Mr. Otto to have had other outside work in view that prohibited his devoting full time to the W. OVERHEU SR. running of the office.

Mr. Otto was re-elected to the office in April, 1935 for the second term.

During his tenure of office he had advocated a consistent emergency program that placed his department on a cash basis and maintained the township roads in excellent condition. The majority of residents of the town will highly commend Mr. Otto's work.

William Overheu Sr. was elected to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Mr. Otto. The voters at the meeting had the option of electing a road commissioner at the meeting Monday or calling a special election to the cost of \$100 or more.

In a circumstance of this kind the town board could take no action or part. The statutes do not allow the board to act unless the electors fail to fill the office between elections. In that case the board would conduct an election of highway commissioner as part of the town board's duties.

It was decided to take action Monday and Mr. Overheu was the only one presented.

An unanimous vote was given in favor of election of Mr. Overheu who has been a resident of Cook township for a number of years and is well known throughout the community. He has been active in the work, assisting Mr. Otto for the last several years.
