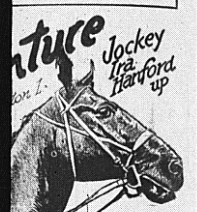
Snow in Morocco

DO YOU KNOW ILLINOIS?

The secretary of state of Illinois is the state librarian ex-officio. The state library and archives division under his jurisdiction contains much information concerning your state. Any questions which are of particular interest to readers and which are not covered in this series will be answered immediately. Address all communications: Edward J. Q. Why did President Cleveland place Chicago under martial law in 1894?

A. The famous Pullman strike during the spring and summer of 1894. Gov. John P. Altgeld objected to the United States troops, saying it was interference with state's rights. President Cleveland announced his firm determination to prevent any interference with mails or with interstate commerce and to protect federal property.

Q. Who was the first negro voter in Southern Illinois?

A. John Evans of Cairo was the first negro to cast a vote after the enfranchisement of the colored race.

Q. Where is Starved Rock?

A. In LaSalle county, near Ottawa, in Starved Rock state park.

Q. Who was the first to use tava in Starved Rock state park.

A. LaSalle. In 1680 LaSalle ordered Tony to erect a fort on Starved Rock "in order to command the Miamis, Outagamis, and Kikapous tribes, and to serve as a place of refuge for the French."

Q. Who made the first map of Illinois and the Mississippi River system?

A. Joliet, on his return from his exploration with Marquette, published several maps of his discoveries. These are the first known maps of this region.

Q. When was the Metamora court house acquired by the state?

A. On August 26, 1921. This is one of the last two remaining court houses in the state in which Lincoln practiced law.

Q. Who purchased the New Salem site in 1907?

A. William Randolph Hearst. He donated it to the Old Salem Chautauque and it subsequently

r rather pretentious scale in 1818. The town served as a county seat for Union and Alexander counties. Q. Who was the first woman lawyer to graduate from an Illinois law school?

A. The first woman lawyer to graduate from a law school in Illinois was Mrs. Ada H. Kepley of Effingham, Ill., who was graduated from the Union College of Law, Chicago, on June 30, 1876.

Q. When was the first dining car operated?

A. The first dining car ever operated was the "Dolmonec." It was built in 1868 and placed in service between Chicago and St. Louis by the Chicago and Alton Railroad company in that year.

Q. What president made the last Thursday in November a national holiday?

A. The first National Thanksgiving Proclamation was made on October 3, 1863, by President Lincoln.

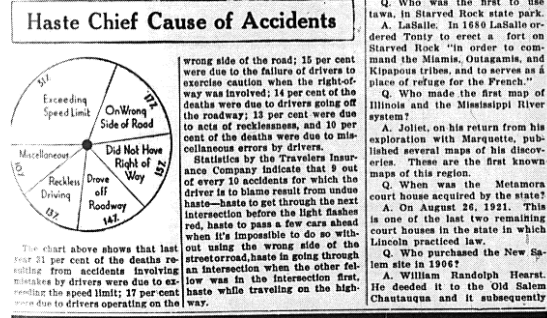
Australia and New Zealand Australia is different, oddly alien in its appeal from New Zealand, its neighbor. It does not possess the lofty peaks, the deep canyons, or active volcanic areas. Its rivers are not the tumbling cascades or its lakes the glacier-cut mirrors of the Dominion. But in vegetation, in animal life it presents a most attractive aspect. It is the most level of all the continents, its tallest mountain, Mt. Kosciuszko, rising but 7,328 feet above sea level.
