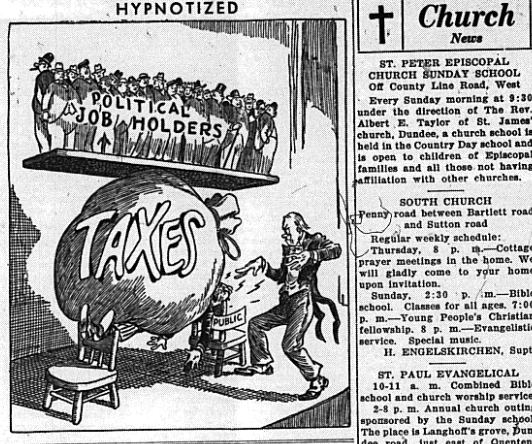

WHAT'S GOING ON IN WASHINGTON

Still upward, despite an unexpected summer slump, climbs the number of persons going back to private employment, continuing a five-month trend for manufacture.

The difference in effect between the executive order and a law is that the executive order may be rescinded by action of the president or any future president.

Electricification by example is added to the methods of rural electrification administration in its efforts to spread the use of current as widely as possible in the 6,000,000 American farms still without the magic fluid of a thousand uses.

As rains mercifully alleviated suffering from the great drought of 1934, the government acts to relieve the needy and sets in motion plans to minimize losses from possible droughts in the future.

First, to collect facts and make recommendations, the president appoints a six-man committee, study and report on a policy for the great plains drought area.

These are to be an end to inter-departmental espionage in the government. Such is the peremptory word that comes from the white house and commands most attention in the public works administration.

Why the detective agency in these branches and why the order? The Justice department has its famous bureau of investigation to combat kidnaping and other crimes having involving interstate movements.

By a stroke of the pen the president puts up a bar to further political patronage in the field of postmaster appointments. In an executive order he decrees that postmasters of the first, second and third classes must hereafter be selected under civil service rules.
