Total Registrations Are 659  
Wednesday; Below Past Two Years

Enrollment in the Barrington public school totaled 659 Wednesday morning, according to a report made by E. S. Smith, superintendent of schools. Elementary grades, excluding kindergarten, had 411 pupils. The kindergarten had 41 children registered Wednesday morning. The total for the high school was 248.

An increase of 10 students was shown in the registrations for the new term at Ela township high school, J. L. Clements, principal, reported Wednesday. The total registration for the four high school classes is 106.

**Farewell Services Are Arranged for College Students**

Program at Methodist Church Sunday; Athletics Meet Thursday

Students who will soon leave Barrington to attend schools, colleges and universities in many different sections of the country are being entertained by local groups.

The new cooking course has 57 girls enrolled and two classes in that subject will be conducted daily. The clothing class, the other subject of home economics, has an enrollment of 29 girls.

The kindergarten class will be divided in nearly equal morning and afternoon classes. The room has been installed above the foyer of the auditorium and the room and its furnishings have been decorated in attractive designs that add color to the setting. The tables and chairs have been painted by the janitors in yellow with a blue trim. The walls are of a light cream color

The freshmen have 38 students, sophomores have 28, juniors 26 and seniors 12. The increase this year is largely due to the greater freshmen enrollment.

Principal Clements reported that a meeting between athletic coaches of Palestine, Wauconda and Ela township high schools was scheduled for Wednesday afternoon to discuss an athletic program for the schools this fall.

He stated that a softball league is being discussed for three schools. This would be substituted for football which is not played by these schools.

Coach Clark explained that it is not necessary for a former letterman to be a member of the B club in order to attend. The invitation is extended to all fellows in the hope of encouraging local interest in high school athletics.
