

Suburban Building Gains Continuing

Suburban building in the Chicago region for the month of September makes a complete record of important gains—a gain of 56 per cent over the same month of last year—a gain of 20 per cent over August—and a gain for the nine months of 1936 over the same period of 1935 of 85 per cent. The figures are as follows:

September 1936, \$2,425,641, compared with September 1935, \$1,557,877, and August 1936, \$2,018,115. The months of January to September, inclusive in 1936 amounting to \$19,666,187 may be compared with \$10,619,409 in 1935; \$5,948,923 in 1934; \$3,925,425 in 1933; \$4,960,247 in 1932 and \$20,822,212 in 1931. We are back, very evidently, to the 1931 volume of suburban building.

The September total of nearly \$2,500,000 amounts up to such an impressive figure chiefly through the inclusion of 161 new homes, the permits for which total \$1,312,447, and also \$238,650 worth of repairs, alterations and additions to homes. Thus homes alone were responsible for a grand total of \$1,550,000 of construction in September.
