With a 12 to 7 defeat of last year's team the local gridiron team today went to a 6 to 0 victory in the homecoming game with Libertyville at the Northside park Sunday afternoon. A similar score in the reverse order has followed the Bronks through most of the season with the exception of two games at 0 to 0.

The Bronks had tough sledding in the first quarter due to the fact that they were bucking a strong wind. The locals did, however, succeed in the working the ball into the last part of the first period. Libertyville had the ball on the 10 yard line, but the Bronchos' line succeeded in putting them for their downs. Grabenroth with the backfield in the second period of the game got off a nice punt, beating the ball out of the danger zone. In the second period the Bronks had the wind at their backs. Cadwallader and Grabenroth did a nice job of putting the ball was so slippery that it was difficult for the receiver to get full possession of it.

he recovered, punting the leather up to the opponents' goal from a spot near the equator. Cadwallader was right in there sending holes in the line for lengthy runs. Mountain was doing a nice job of tackling, as always, throwing the opponents for short losses. The team as a whole played a nice game throughout.

Ticky, the Bronks dependable quarterback was out of the game due to an injured arm received in the game at Lake Forest the previous Friday. Shepard replaced Ticky, doing a fine job.

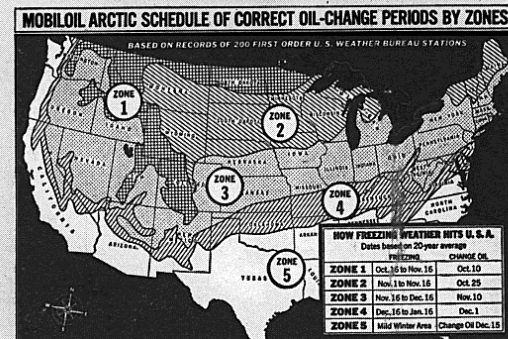
