Final Local Tabulation Shows G.O.P. Percentage Gain Over Last Year

The final election of the local Democratic Party at election November 3 has been pointed out correctly that the Republicans registered a percentage gain throughout the four-year territory of Ill. Cuba, Barrington and Palatine although the Democrats gained throughout the majority of the balance of Illinois.

In selecting one office filed by election two years ago and that year that of congressman, the G.O.P. showed a gain in nearly all of the eight precincts. Republican Congressman Church lead democratic candidate Maloney 1039 to 525 in Cuba and Elia two years ago. This year he lead Democratic Candidate Wrightman 1346 to 570. Democratic Congressman Schuetz lead Republican Candidate Pennington only 555 to 1410 in Barrington and Palatine two years ago. This year he trailed Moreland 1226 to 2225, two to one. The same can be followed throughout other offices up for election both years.

However, the democratic candidate this year ran slightly better percentage than they did four years ago.

County Supervisors Vote Pay Reductions

In a new economy move the board of supervisors of Lake county cut the annual salaries of two county elective officers, raised the pay of one, and put aside for consideration by the fees and salaries committee a petition signed by county officers and county employes for a return to the higher wage scales prior to 1932 at a regular meeting Tuesday.

The fees and salary committee introduced a resolution for annual salaries of \$2600 for Circuit Clerk

canary yellow with black numerals. Numerals on the plate will be black and the background will be canary yellow. The year and name of the state will be stamped "19-Illinois-37" above the license numbers instead of below as on this year's plates.

Car owners desiring reassignment of their 1936 numbers must make request and file their application before December 1st. Those re-registering the same car should send their 1936 registration card along with the application.

Motorists registering new cars will be required to furnish the secretary of state's office with a bill of sale as an official record for the motor vehicle department. They must also apply for a certificate of title. Secretary Hughes said that many owners re-registering cars last year were under the erroneous impression that they were required to obtain a new certificate of title. A certificate of title is good for the life of the car when in the original owner's possession.

Motorists applying for plates for newly acquired used cars must furnish evidence of ownership in the form of a properly endorsed certificate of title. Secretary Hughes urged motorists to check the schedule of fees before applying for licenses. Through Secretary Hughes' efforts the legislature made the following reductions which went into effect last year for the first time: \$5 plates reduced to \$6.00; \$12 plates reduced to \$10.50; \$20 plates reduced to \$17; \$25 plates reduced to \$22; motorcycle fees were reduced from \$4 to \$3.
