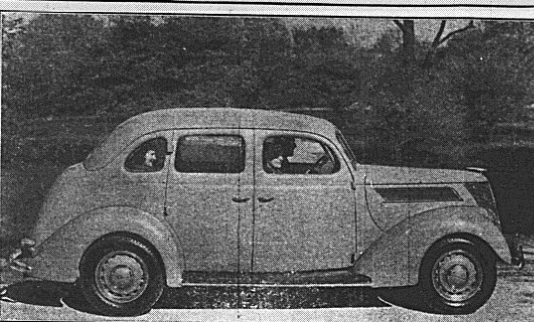
Fox River Grove
