Charles Drussel Named President of College Class

Sophomore Classmates Elect Him Leader at Bradley Tech at Peoria

Charles Drussel, son of Rev. and Mrs. Charles R. Drussel, 407 Grove avenue, was honored by classmates when he was elected president of the sophomore class, Bradley school of Technology, Peoria, at school elections Tuesday.

His election was made fairly impressive, a bulletin from the school reported, by the large majority he received, compared with other margins registered in the races for various offices at the Hilltop school.

The election attracted a great deal of interest on the campus and voting was unusually heavy, it report stated. Balloting took place under the supervision of the student council.

Charles' popularity on the campus is due to other activities which he has participated during his two years there. It was learned. At the present time, he is assistant manager of student placement, a member of the Cadet club, and the editor of the campus newspaper.

All students seeking employment this year have been placed in positions through the efforts of Mr. Drussel at business houses, various parts of the city. He has four assistants taking care of the many details and has placed over 100 students in permanent jobs.

State School for Boys Seeks Foster Homes in Localities

In a campaign to find foster homes for boys from the State School for Boys, local representatives have been contacting newspapers and group leaders in all sections of the state.

E. B. Parkratz, foster-home placement department, was in Barrington last week and issued the following statement that is planned to start the program:

"Each boy considered for foster home placement has been carefully arranged program of the school with credit to him."

"Before actual placement, made a boy's case is passed upon by a foster home placement committee made up of a group of individuals foremost in Chicago's leading child welfare agencies. Previous to this the advisory placement is considered by the school staff committee."

"Following his placement, an experienced man case worker makes semi-monthly supervision of the foster home to assist the foster mother when needed in control of a particular boy. The state will pay \$20 per month based on all boys placed and an additional \$5 per month for clothing and other incidentals."

"We are especially interested in farm foster homes where the school population is large. However, we are just as interested to hear from small town homes."
