Mr. Carlson spoke on "Three Second Selling," explaining the Mrs. Shopper passes the average downtown window in three seconds. The old country store window with a large variety and assortment of merchandise can catch her attention.

The speaker had a miniature store with a variety of removable fronts to illustrate the most effective window display an assortment of light reflecting devices, hurt the display by creating a false color to the goods. He demonstrated how colored light could be used in a window which a strong white light was reflected directly on the display.
