Authorities Anticipate Heavy Increase in Christmas Business

The United States postal department through its local unit has requested the cooperation of mail patrons in mailing holiday mail early in order to relieve the heavy burden encountered each year by the department.

C. C. Snyder, local acting postmaster, estimated the volume of mailing to be done before Christmas will be many times in excess of the normal volume.

The latest date for foreign mailing is December 14 and postal authorities request proper declaration of packages for foreign customs to expedite delivery.
