Begin Moving First Families Into RRA Lake County Tracts

With the first family moving into the substitute homestead of the Rural Resettlement Administration in Lake County Thursday, the settlement is now started. Before the winter is much advanced, according to the RRA, most of the 53 homesteads. If not all of them, will be occupied.

That was the indication at the RRA office in Waukegan, this week where heads of families who have been assigned homesteads have been consulting Mrs. Tillie Jane Kelly, in charge of the office about temporary licenses to occupy the premises.

Only one family from Cook county, the man of which works in Waukegan, will be given leave to move into a homestead. The other 52 will be occupied by resident families of the area.

Before the temporary license is signed, the prospective homesteader is given an outline of his responsibilities. The first year of occupancy is entirely on a rental basis and will give the homesteader an opportunity to decide on whether he wants to go into a permanent contract. The rental payments during the first year do not apply to the contract purchase price.

The purchase price of the 53 homesteads, with an average of 10 acres of land, a house of from four or seven rooms, a barn, garage, a well and other necessary structures, will average \$5500.

Next spring the RRA will help the homesteaders plant small orchards, with about 12 trees an acre, strawberry, tomato plants on each of the tracts.

Rent to be paid by the homesteaders during the first 30 months of occupancy under the temporary license will generally be equal to the installments to be paid under the purchase contract over a period of 40 years. However, a homesteader family living on one of these tracts will have an option to purchase the tract and may terminate the option by moving out after trying the homestead for several months.
