

Store Fronts Can Be Decorated With Lions Club Lights

Organization Will Not Undertake Street Christmas Lighting

Christmas decorative light strings owned by the Barrington Lions club will be available to all business firms in the village wanting them, the club members decided Monday night.

Any merchant who wants to borrow a string and bulbs can get the former at the Arno S. Sasse hardware and the bulbs at Miller Hardware hardware. A deposit of \$1.50 for each string and 10 cents for each bulb will be asked. The \$1.50 will be paid back when the string is returned. The bulbs will be sent back returned with a rental charge of 5 cents per bulb. Some merchants probably will borrow the strings and use their own colored light bulbs.

The Lions club will not do any street lighting this year as they have several previous years. The original plan of placing small Christmas trees in the flag poles did not prove very satisfactory. Many trees were knocked over and more than half the total supply of bulbs were broken by cars hitting them when being parked and by wind and storm.

Funeral services were held Thursday and burial took place at Hartford, Mich.
