

"Labeled Lady" Is Week-End Feature for Movie Patrons

Will Rogers Picture Closes Tonight: "Dimples" Here Three Days

With the revival of Will Rogers' "Ambassador Bill," finishing its run at the Catlow theatre tonight, Clark Gable and Marion Davies in "Cain and Abel," showing Friday and Saturday, "Labeled Lady," with four great stars coming Sunday and Monday, and Little Shirley Temple in "Dimples," scheduled for the Christmas program, moviegoers will find bright and interesting film fare for the early holidays. "Cain and Abel" is an elaborate production which swings from the prize ring to the musical comedy stage, with a rich vein of comedy in evidence at all times. Gable strikes a particularly virile note, while the music and the spectacular beauty of the ensemble numbers form entrancing sequences of loveliness. "Labeled Lady" is the Sunday-Monday feature, arrests the attention at once with its outstanding quartet of stars—William Powell, Myrna Loy, Jean Harlow and Spencer Tracy. The pique of an over-rich hearse over a newspaper story forms the theme of this bubbling and humorous yarn. Construction reigns in the office of the paper when she sees for a cool five million. William Powell is enlisted to make love to the dame in order to side-track her suit. The merry misadventures that follow make "Labeled Lady" a fast entertainer.

The double feature program for bargain night, next Wednesday, will offer Harold Bell Wright's "Wild Brant Kent" and an original story written especially for Ross Alexander and Glenda Farrell titled "Here Comes Carter." "Wild Brant Kent" is Western in atmosphere, stars Humphrey Bogart and Mae Clark. "Here Comes Carter" has to do with a gossip reporter who gets into trouble due to his outstanding items. Comedy is the key note, and the stars hold it to a rollicking high pitch throughout.

"Dimples" will play next week Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, with shows continuous from three o'clock Christmas day. Little Shirley Temple appears in "Dimples" as a street singer, who earns money for the keep of herself and grandfather—played by Frank Morgan. Her clever singing and dancing wins for her many friends both in high and low places, and she is finally given the role of Little Eva in a revival of "Uncle Tom's Cabin." Complications between characters, both romantic and financial, enter into the plot.

Short subjects have been especially chosen and include "Our Gang" in a new comedy, a Mickey Mouse cartoon, and a color scenic of Yellowstone National Park.
