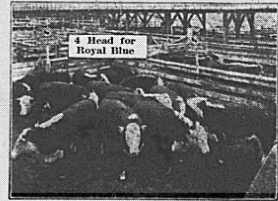

A symbolized version of the Lord's prayer will be a feature of the Sunday school program to be presented at the Baptist church at 7:30 p.m. Christmas Eve under the leadership of Mrs. Walter Sears. There will also be songs, recitations and poems, followed by the arrival of Santa Claus. A candle light service will be held at the Baptist church at 7:30 p.m. Sunday under the direction of Mrs. Annie Montgomery. St. Timothy's Home will give "The First Christmas," a violin quartet including the Misses Dawn, Landner, Margaret, Ann Shepley, Edna and Beth Sears will play and there will be songs by the choir and a quartet, Edgar, Misses Mildred and LaFern Huchel and Arthur Caste. These will serve as organist.

"The Shepherd's Story," "Gifts to the Christ Child" and a play "The First Christmas" have been arranged. In addition there will be carols and recitations. Christmas candle light and communion services will be held at the St. Paul church at 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. Christmas Day. St. Matthew December 24. The annual program of Sunday school children will be held at St. Matthew's church at 7:30 p.m. Christmas Eve. Salem Program December 24. Mrs. L. Schaefer and Mrs. Edward Wagner have arranged a Christmas Eve program to be presented by 45 pupils of the Sunday school at Salem church Tuesday evening. Songs, tableaux, drama and recitations will be included in the celebration. Methodist Program December 24.
