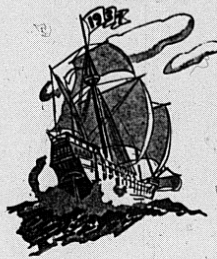

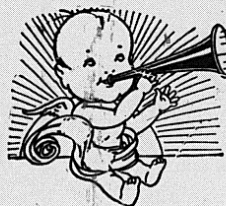

Local Firm Sells
9 Truck Fleet to
Air Line Company

A fleet of nine 1½ ton Chevrolet trucks was sold by Schaumburg Chevrolet Sales last week to the United Air Lines in a deal which is one of the largest motor vehicle sales ever transacted in Barrington.

These trucks, sent out for distribution Saturday, went to the company's headquarters at the following places: Chicago, Salt Lake City, Omaha, Cheyenne, Cleveland and Newark.

The machines were assembled at the Chevrolet garage on North Cook street Wednesday ready for distribution Saturday. They were identical 4477 machines, and probably will be used to haul materials to and from the landing fields.

Schaumburg Chevrolet Sales, organized in 1935, has built up a very creditable business in sales and service of the leading selling unit of General Motors corporation. The company has moved a large number of passenger cars as well as trucks.

Numbers for Social
Security Act Here

Employees registered under the social security act will receive their numbers within the next few days as quickly as the mailmen can prepare them for delivery. Those employees who fled through their employers will receive the numbers where they work while others will receive them from the postman.

Approximately 500 numbers have come in the local post office in the last two days. C. C. Snyder, acting postmaster, reported. The number is used as an identification of the employee under social security act provisions as a means of keeping the individual records straight.

When the persons receive their cards they are to submit them to their employers for filing the numbers but are to retain their cards.
