

Bronchos Lose to Alumni Monday; Church League to Open January 11

'35-'36 Graduates Defeat Bronchos 27 to 22 Monday

Two Teams of Previous Years Battle in Exciting Tilt in Second Game

The team made up of players of the class of '32 lost to the quintet of players of previous graduating classes by a 21 to 23 score on the high school court in the first of two alumni games Monday night.

The team of the graduating classes of 1935 and 1936 defeated the BHS Bronchos 27 to 22 in the second game of the evening.

First Game

The team of '32 players were led in white while the players of previous years were in red. The whites started the game by piling up five points to the reds three and held this score for the first quarter. Both teams began scoring heavily bringing the tally up to a 13 all score at the half. The game re-versed back and forth until the third was also ended at 23 to 23 tie. Dave Capilli sunk a charity toss and Beerman scored a field goal at the final horn.

Broncho-Alumni Tilt

The Bronchos held their shots to short ones in the first half with very few long attempts. In the last half they were forced to take more lengthy shots, but none of the real long ones registered. Gaare led the scoring for the Bronchos with six points. Grabenkamp was the runner-up with five points. Earl Etters piled up 12 points to lead the alumni scoring.

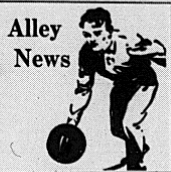
