

Association Report Reveals State Aid to School Expense

Larger state-wide made in school expenditures in Illinois than in most states during the depression and the Illinois State Education Association issued this week by the Illinois Education Association. The average cost per resident school pupil in the United States from 1935 to 1936 was \$14.50, while Illinois cost schools 25 per cent during the same period.

Of the states with the greatest population, Ohio and Michigan were the only two states to make an increase in state aid to school Illinois, and in both of these states a strong program was adopted. For the school year ending in 1936 Michigan increased its state aid grant of \$4.11 per pupil and in Ohio the state aid grant was \$4.12. The state aid grant in Illinois would be \$1.19. Both of these states aid high schools but Illinois does not.

The crisis conditions still exist in Illinois. The increase in the state aid grant of \$1.19 per pupil does not meet the emergency. The state aid grant is \$1.19 per pupil and the high school pupils are still left out. This slight increase in state aid grant does not compensate the schools for their loss in local support due to the depression and the valuation of the state of 37 percent in 1937.

The position of the Education Association states, "As the effects of the depression continue, it must be emphasized that scores of districts are still unable to meet their financial handicaps. Many have a debt load far in excess of the estimated value of their property on the assessed valuation, have bonds defaulted, or for months have not been able to meet their school standards, and can not hope to offer an adequate school program from their emergency. Many schools were poor prior to the depression."



"Sit-Down" Strike
Halts Zion Work

A "sit-down" strike is going up all activities of Zion building industry at Zion with more than 25 workers of various building trades being affected. The men have been occupying the steel-mill and yards, which are situated between Elgin and the Chicago and North Western tracks, and they declare they will remain there until their demands at the Zion Industries, Inc., of which Overseer Willibl Glenn Voliva is president, are met. The men demand recognition of their union organization recently formed. This recognition would mean a 10 per cent increase in the wages of the mechanics to the prevailing union scales elsewhere in Lake County.

This is the first labor union in Zion, and the men are the lace workers, who were organized many years ago. Carl Michelson Jr., a former employee of the building firm, is president of the new organization. N. W. Estow, Elbow, is the business manager. He has for many years a private chauffeur for Overseer Voliva, a trustee.

The men, who are 25, together with Secretary Harold Stevens, called the strike Saturday.

President Michelson said Sunday that Zion Industries, Inc., had refused to recognize the union, but would form under the Lake County Building Trades Council, which is only making an effort of bringing them to our terms of agreement in the first place.

When asked whether or not officials of the industries had been in touch with the strikers, Mr. Michelson said: "Not they have not, but when they do, we will be in touch with them to see that their plans they will soon give us a hearing."

The workers in the industries are a part of the building industry and the "sit-down" strikes have refused to be broken up and removed from the bins. Saturday after two of the men struck, the other 23 who struck removed the ignition keys and the drivers were not allowed to work.

A Waukegan coal dealer made delivery of one truckload of coal to the strikers Saturday morning after the drivers obtained city protection to and from the city.

It is reported that more than 200 men in the building industry were affected by this strike, as carpenters and other tradesmen of the 200 industries refused to join the "sit-down" strikers today in sympathy with their demands.

Labor conditions were blamed for the formation of a home union, and the men are asking for a 10 per cent increase in wages. Sunday evening, Zion Building Industry, a division of the Building Trades Council, met at the Zion Women's Union at Bensenville and the action was reported as an outcome of the labor trouble.

Pat Whiting, president of the Zion Building Industry, indicated that the men in the building industry may have had something to do with the bombing when the bombing began early Monday.

LABOR SINCE THE NRA

Proposals to revise the NRA, to establish a 30-hour week, and to extend the hard-door NRA represented by the Walsh-Haley government contracts act, combine to make particularly timely the study of changes in wages, hours and employment in the NRA, compiled by the National Industrial Conference Board.

The gains in volume of production and industrial prosperity since the supreme court declared NRA unconstitutional in May, 1935, are too well known to call for further emphasis.

Under the NRA hourly wage rates were advanced nearly 42 per cent. When the NRA was thrown out, it was widely declared that these gains would be lost. Reports and rumors of wage cuts were frequent. But on the average, there were no reduction in hourly wage rates since NRA terminated. In fact, the average hourly wage rates for all industries, over, have actually increased 15 per cent compared with those in the NRA period. Even when allowance is made for a slight increase in the cost of living since then, the purchasing power of wages in September, 1936, was still 6.4 per cent higher than it was at the end of the NRA period. And it was this that was considered when the 30-hour week, had created employment, the report showed that employment now stands at 86.5 per cent of the 1929 level as against an average of 75.1 per cent during the NRA period.

These (and other facts) serve once more to indicate one of the many weaknesses of the proposal to establish the 30-hour week. Proponents of the proposal overestimate the actual length of the working week at present. This factual misconception is wholly apart from the direct violation of established convention which the 30-hour week involves in principle. Wages were not only cut out of the product that labor helps to make. There is no way it can be made by producing less.—New York Times.

LAWFUL PURPOSE

The legal status of the simple strike has been definitely settled in favor of the strike if the strike is for what the courts call a "lawful purpose." The supreme court of the United States in 1921 said:

"The right to combine for such a lawful purpose has in many years not been denied in any court. The strike became a lawful instrument in a lawful economic struggle."

There is disagreement, however, on what constitutes a lawful purpose. All courts agree that these purposes include strikes for higher wages, shorter hours and improved working conditions.

When the self-interest of the employe, which makes such purposes lawful, is overruled by the general welfare, as where the public interest directly or indirectly demands it, the strike exists. The courts of New York have ruled that unionization too, is a lawful purpose, being "sufficient to justify the harm."

Modern economic organization, the court of appeals has said, "is not based on the single shop. Unions believe that wages may be increased and collective bargaining maintained only if certain conditions prevail, not in some single factory, but generally."

Picketing and its legality have been a prolific source of legal controversy. Again the courts agree that picketing is a legitimate means of economic coercion if it is confined to persons. They disagree, however, as to the lawful scope of this means.—United States News.
