









## Lake County Poor Expense Mounting

Poor relief in the 18 Lake county towns is mounting to a new record. The total for the year to date of 1936 with 2238 welfare cases, representing approximately 10,000 individuals, is \$1,000,000. An increase of 154 families over the month of January.

For the 18 towns the total has estimated a necessary expenditure of \$7,485 in February for the poor relief cases. Of this amount the state has made an allotment of \$34,822 from the IERIC which is to be distributed among the towns. The towns are asked to have in the box for the poor relief levies in the various towns.

The towns of Glenview, Winnetka, Deerfield and New Prospect, which did not make the maximum levy of \$100,000, will receive a pro rata share of the allotment for poor relief will not receive any of the state funds. In December, 1936, the State Auditor W. Steele's report showed an increase of 26 new families in February over January. The estimated cost for relief for February is \$850.

The total cost of the 2238 relief cases in the county during the month will be \$1,000,000. Poor relief cases consist of food, rent in many cases, fuel, clothing, hospitalization, care of cases of inmates at the poor farm.
