## Shutdown Strikers at Zion Return to Work After Parley

The shutdown strikers of the Zion building industries at Zion got up early to work last Thursday with very little to show for their efforts, except possibly a raised mood after their two and one-half day voluntary vacation.

Carpenters and mill workers in the yard and planning mill resumed their labors after their strike committee rejected the proposal of H. R. Phillips, assistant general manager of the Zion Industries, Inc.

The proposal called for an immediate return to work of the strikers with no discrimination against union or non-union employees, the formation of a shop committee by three employees to present any grievances to the officials of the industries and with no immediate changes in the present wage scale or shop conditions.

The difficulty first arose when building trades workers first organized into a trades union and presented their demands to heads of the Zion Industries.

The shutdown strike tactics were adopted in an effort to hasten the matter.

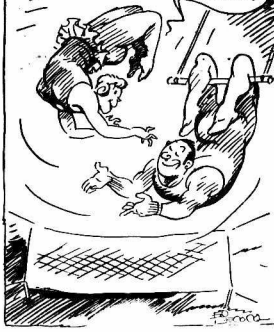
