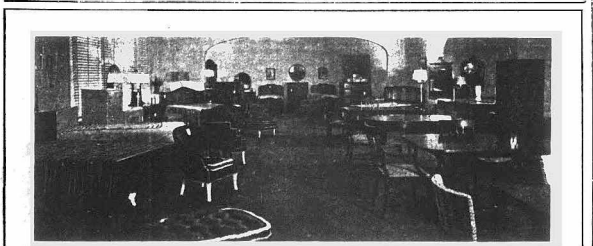

May Ask County to Maintain Some of Barrington Roads

State or county aid and maintenance for part of Barrington town's 42 miles of primary roads was suggested by several town trustees Tuesday by Ernest Hughes, rural trustee, who declared that annual maintenance should be taken to provide better roads.

A committee to make a survey of the system and to request that the roads need better maintenance will be appointed by W. H. Hawley, supervisor. H. O. Sodi, clerk, and other members of the board. Mr. Hughes and the road commissioner August Hunter will be on the committee. The other members will be named within a week or two.

Mr. Hughes told members present that the roads need better maintenance. He suggested the tax rate may be too low to provide adequate funds for proper maintenance of a large mileage. Bar-

ington has 42 miles of roadway, 60 per cent more than the majority of rural towns in this territory. The committee to be appointed will survey the road situation and determine what course should be followed.

If the county will take over two or three roads, the town mills will be reduced and the funds per mile increased accordingly.
