

Local Population Estimated at 3703 By Federal Bureau

**490 Increase for Five Years
Based on Formula for
National Total**

Barrington's population for
1936 is estimated at 3703, having

increased approximately 490 during the five years from 1931 through 1936, according to a formula worked out by the census bureau and used by the bureau to compute national populations. Based primarily on an estimate of the national population for 1936, the census bureau formula considers the number of births and deaths and net immigration and emigration since 1931. According to the formula, Barrington was made for unregistered births and deaths. The national population, so estimated, is 175,212,600, an increase of 4,744,500 over the 1931 population. Barrington's

population was 3211 in 1930 and 3749 in 1936. To figure Barrington's population by the census bureau formula, which is rather complicated, the relationship of the population increase between 1931 and 1936 to the increase between 1926 and 1931 for the country as a whole is adjusted for Barrington according to the relationship which Barrington's 1936 to 1931 population increase has to that of the whole country for the same period. The chief factor in the reduced rate at which the population of the United States has increased since 1926, as compared to the ten year period prior to 1926, is a slackening off in immigration, according to the census bureau. A declining birth rate has also been a factor in this trend, the bureau reports. The bureau warns that the population estimate obtained by its formula is necessarily based on the assumption that the relative increase between one decade and another has been the same since 1926 as it was during the decade before, and that in at least some instances this regularity of increase has not been maintained.

Suburban Building Has Best Increase Since January, 1931

Building in the suburb of March in the Chicago area month of March placed one of the most impressive amounts recorded by this survey since January, 1931—a total of \$3,646,255, according to the July 1931 which had \$2,819,400. The March total is nearly twice that of February, which amounted to \$1,826,000, and nearly one and one-half times that of January, which had \$1,577,000. March also exceeded March 1936, \$2,723,000 by almost a million dollars—a gain of 14 per cent.

Still another comparison is of interest—that between the amount of building in March in the suburban region, \$3,646,255, and the amount in the city of Chicago in July, \$2,219,400—a million and a half more new construction in the suburbs than in the city. The increase that has occurred in suburban building is indicated by the fact that new construction in the one month of March was more than the totals for either the first or the last six months of 1932 and 1934, excepting the last half of 1934, which amounted to one million more than the one month now in its sixth month of year.
