Suburban Building in April Sets New Four Million High

Suburban building in April amounted to a new high figure in surprising proportions, the total volume of permits issued by fitty-eight communities amounting to \$4.424.193—the first four million dollar figure since 1929. It succeeds March, which had \$1,862.255, by 21 her cent and shrift of last year. March, which had \$3,5463,255, by 21 per cent and April of last year, with \$3,109,348, by 42 per cent. The improvement in suburban building which began in March of last year enabled 1926 to double the figure of 1935. Even this hard-

the figure of 1935. Even this hard-ity warranted any expectation of month this spring averaging 44. The low year of the depression in the building industry, as in others, was 1935, and the worst month of that year was March. In bean building amounting to only 1938.346. Simple division shows that suburban building activities are now 22 times as great as they that subtrain building activities are now 22 (lines as great as they were then. And, March 1931, bad as it was, was only a little worse than several other months of that year for the average of the year was only 315,000 per month. The average thus far this year is 32,550,000 per month or eight times as much. And this includes the seasonally poor months of January and February, while it seems evident that a number of months equally as good as or better than April are yet to come.
