County Holstein Breeders Consign to National Sale

The fifty-second annual convention of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America, the world's largest cattle registry organization, is to be held in Chicago this year, June 1 and 2. Delegates from nearly every state will convene to act upon important dairy and association affairs. Immediately following the convention, the great National Holstein sale will be held at the famous Elmwood Farms a few miles north of Chicago at Deerfield on June 3. Choice Holsteins have been selected by the sale committee from the leading breeding establishments from coast to coast and Canada. As the Holstein cattle market has been rapidly improving for the past two years, this important sale will be watched with keen interest by cattlemen.

Elmwood Farms, the location of the national sale, is consigning two bulls and a heifer to the sale. One of the bulls, King Beasle Dictator, born September 12, 1936 is sired by King Bossie Ormsby Fisterie and his mother is Queen Bossie Ormsby with a record of \$49.3 lbs. fat and 21,936.2 lbs. milk. The other bull is King Beasle Fobes Dixie, born March 1, 1934. Charles Wray of Graylake is consigning a fine three-year-old heifer named Loco Beasle Ella. She was sired by King Bossie Ormsby Fisterie and her mother, Fobes Pinterie Ormsby Ella, has a record of 592.9 lbs. fat and 15,583.8 lbs. milk which are Illinois state records in class C.
