

# Gold Coasters Trounce Bronchos in Grid Battle Saturday; Score 13-0

## Locals Will Meet Libertyville in Season's Finale

Lake Forest Eleven Scores in First and Fourth Periods for Easy Victory

The Lake Forest Gold Coasters handed the Barrington Bronchos their fourth straight football defeat of the 1937 season by a score of 13 to 0 at North Park last Saturday.

Williams, feet colored half-back, scored both of Lakes Forest's touchdowns after long drives in the first and fourth periods. The ball was in Barrington's territory for the majority of the game.

Visitors Score Early  
After steady rains by Rose, Williams, and Peachman in the first period, the Gold Coasters managed to bring the ball up to the Bronchos 2-yard line where the ball was again given to Williams, who scored on a plunge over his right guard. The try for the extra point failed when Rose's pass was incomplete.

Church, who was taken out in the first half, came back in the game for Barrington in the last period and started tossing passes, which failed to connect. About halfway in the last quarter Church kicked, thus giving Lake Forest the ball and they again moved down to the Barrington 1-yard line where Williams plunged over. White, Gold Coaster guard, dropped back and with Rose holding the ball, kicked the extra point.

The Bronchos will invade the Libertyville high school football field next Friday where they will play their last grid game of the 1937 season against Coach A. Bergstrom's Wildcats. The Wildcats have been rested highly in the conference and have a record of 3 wins, one defeat, and one tie game. The Bronchos will attempt to down the Libertyville boys for the second straight year. Last year the locals won over their opponents by a 6 to 0 score. It should prove to be a fairly even battle.
