The sudden boost is explained by the recent act of congress which allows federal income tax schedules to be available to local collectors, Assessor Clark stated.

The 116 per cent increase in the township will materially affect the township will materially affect the tax rate of the township and in some cases the village of Barrington and school district No. 4.
